Purpose: Serve the State of Arkansas through charitable events to help needy citizens.

Positions: Volunteers are needed to help with special events in February and November. Minimum age is 18.

Purpose: Improves the quality of life for indigent people.

Positions: All medical professions for free clinic Tuesday and Sunday afternoons, assistance with the clothing bus, job training, literacy tutors, counselors, facility maintenance, general office and receptionists, and fund raising. Minimum age is 16 unless accompanied by an adult.

Purpose: To provide emergency aid to local and transient people in need.

Purpose: Provide free hot meals and healthcare.

Positions: Cook and serve food Monday – Friday from 12pm – 1pm. Nurses are needed to provide healthcare on Fridays from 12pm – 1pm. Minimum age is 14.

ST. FRANCIS HOUSE

Purpose: Provide material assistance to the disadvantaged and help them become self-reliant.

Positions: Mentor/tutor youth and parents, child care aides, distribute food, sort clothing, receptionist, clerical duties, building maintenance, drive truck, medical personnel for free clinic on Tuesdays. Minimum age is 16.

WATERSHED

Purpose: Help people help themselves by providing food, jobs and shelter.

Positions: Crisis intervention, job placement counseling, answer phones, assist clients, intake workers, and many more programs. Minimum age varies.

Purpose: To support the Central AR Library System and holdings in ways not normally provided by public fundraising and to promote the library in the community.

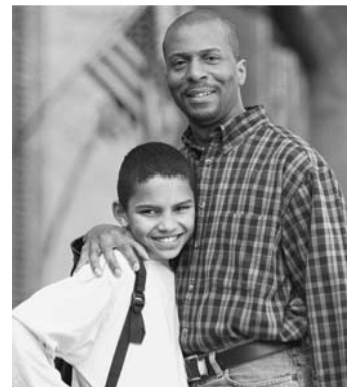
Positions: Volunteers are needed to assist in the library store, at book sales and related activities. Minimum age is 18 and training is provided.

Purpose: Teach basic reading and writing to adults using one to one tutoring.

Positions: Tutor English speaking or non-English speaking adults twice a week for 60-90 minutes. Training is provided. Minimum age is 18.

Purpose: To provide organized programs for dependents of active and retired military personnel.

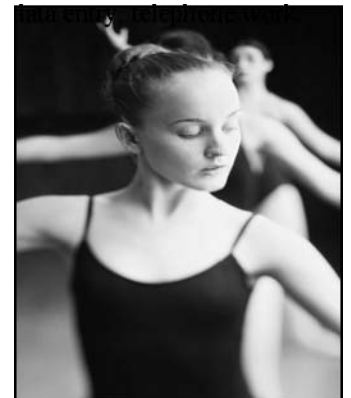
