INVESTING IN FINANCIAL STABILITY



Heart of Arkansas United Way's Financial Stability partners have a specific focus on programs to provide a pathway toward longterm financial stability and economic mobility for those living below the ALICE threshold (ALICE + below FPL). These grants are not intended to meet the basic needs of ALICE individuals and families (Basic Needs funds will be available through a separate grant process). The impact of this work is seen also in improved education and health outcomes for all members of a family.

Efforts may include:

- Training and adult education to enable individuals to find employment or increase income.
- Asset building, including homeownership or building savings.
- Homelessness prevention and response (services to help people find or keep safe and affordable housing).
- Financial education.
- Debt and fine/fee reduction and mitigation.
- Re-entry programs and services.

Focusing on ALICE

29% of hardworking Arkansas are ALICE: Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed. ALICE households have incomes which exceed the Federal Poverty Level, but are not high enough to cover their basic needs. An additional 17% of Arkansans live below the Federal Poverty Level.

We rely on ALICE, and yet ALICE is too often making critical sacrifices to make ends meet.

United Way Community Investment grants in Financial Stability are focused on helping individuals and families living below the ALICE threshold thrive. For more information about ALICE families in our state, see the sidebar.
