As Heart of Arkansas United Way looks to better measure and communicate our impact, we've updated our language. Our Youth Opportunity impact area encompasses what was formerly our Education focus area - but our priorities haven't changed.

Heart of Arkansas United Way's Youth Opportunity partners are focused on setting up children (18 and under) up for success. The continuum of work begins at birth, ensuring that children enter kindergarten ready to learn, and continues through high school graduation.

Efforts may include:

- Early childhood education: investment in preschool and/or quality childcare, or support for parents of young children.
- Tutoring, mentoring, or other resources aligned with ageappropriate metrics (i.e., reading on grade level, math proficiency, school transitions, career pathways).
- Leadership, character, and durable skill development.

Focused on ALICE

28% of hardworking Arkansans are ALICE: **A**sset **L**imited, Income **C**onstrained, **E**mployed. ALICE households have incomes which exceed the Federal Poverty Level, but are not high enough to cover their basic needs. An additional 16% of Arkansans live below the Federal Poverty Level.

We rely on ALICE, and yet ALICE is too often making critical sacrifices to make ends meet.

United Way Community Investment grants in Youth Opportunity are focused on helping children living below the ALICE threshold to thrive. From providing educational resources that may feel out of reach in a typical ALICE household budget to offering support for students facing barriers, we want to know how your work is focused on ALICE.
